Are You Our Next Duty Officer?

Quite often we call for volunteers to help out at our Branch Library, and one of the roles available is 'Duty Officer'. If you've ever thought about volunteering but are not quite sure what this involves, you are more than welcome to call in and find out! Far from being daunting, potential Duty Officers are encouraged to visit and 'shadow' our more experienced volunteers to learn, ask questions, and simply explore the library until they feel comfortable enough to join the team.

Each Tuesday two Duty Officers are rostered on, with the main role of welcoming and helping visitors as they conduct their own research or look for information. This can involve suggesting one of our many and varied resources, showing them the latest research resources and acquisitions, assisting them to get set-up on a computer, or simply asking questions to help them gain clarity on what they are seeking.

On quieter days, Duty Officers are also welcome to undertake some project work – for example indexing, sorting or filing material – depending on what's needed.

There is also some administration work involved (for example recording data and issuing receipts), but all of this occurs in a highly supported environment; there is always another volunteer around to help if you are unable to answer a question.

For visitors to the library who are newer to genealogy, this may also involve helping them get started, and working alongside them as they continue to explore and find information.

The main criteria is a love of family history!

If this sounds like you, we'd love for you to contact us or come along any Tuesday (10am-3pm) to see how it all works. Duty Officers typically work in the library one day per month, however we are very flexible and happy to discuss individual circumstances.

We are also calling for expressions of interest from Members wishing to volunteer as a "**Research Assistant**". For further information on this particular role, please contact or visit the Library.

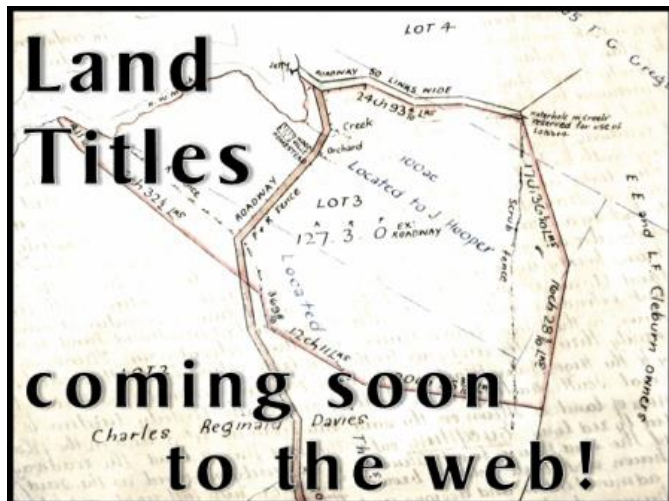
England and Wales Certificate Service

If you do not have easy access to the internet yourself, or aren't comfortable using your credit card details online, you can still order a certificate from GRO (General Register Office). Call in and see us at the Branch Library to ask about the record(s) you are interested in.

Birth, Death & Marriage records for England & Wales (from 1 July 1837) can be ordered on your behalf for \$25 per certificate which includes postage. You will need to have some information about the record (names, year, quarter, district etc). Bring what information you have, and we will check to see if it is correct, before ordering. Please allow up to 5 weeks for delivery from UK.

Land Titles Update

Did you know that work has commenced on a project to digitise of a wide range of Land Tasmania paper records currently stored in the Lands Building? According to the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment (DPIPWE) website work has commenced on a project to scan, compile and index the Registry of Deeds, with the aim of documents being available in the future via online access.



The digitisation began in December 2017, with expected completion by May this year. Deeds Indexes were expected to be available online in February 2018, with the remaining Deeds Memorials accessible online by July 2018.

The Project will deliver digital copies of over 1.5 million records, allowing more convenient and instant access through [The LIST website](#).

Very exciting news for those of us who have spent time examining documents in the Land Titles Office in Hobart.
